**Volunteer Agreement:**

By signing below you agree to foster for Corgi Rescue of Eastern NY (Kathy Moore, Director). You understand that you, the foster:

- are to keep the rescue corgi in a safe environment while they are settling into your home
- transport the dog to the vet if requested and arranged by CRENY at the designated veterinarian
- if any medication is required by the vet that you follow the instructions and provide the medication as indicated
- food will be provided by CRENY. Please follow proper food changing steps if this was not the food the corgi was eating prior to rescue. We try to have the corgi on a good quality food before adoption
- Kathy Moore of CRENY is the only authorized person to work on the potential adopters and the placement process. Any friends or family interested in the rescue corgi are to contact Kathy directly, complete an adoption application and go through the normal screening process.
- All food, vet care, collars and leads are provided by CRENY. Approval and receipts must be provided for re-imbusement
- Any interest in adopting the rescue corgi must be made within 24 hrs. There are many already approved adopters on a waiting list. Their screening process may have already started and are then considered the first potential adopter and the foster would be secondary
- By signing this Volunteer/Foster Agreement you release Corgi Rescue of Eastern New York and Kathleen Moore, Director of any liability due to the behavior of the rescue corgi.
